Joel & Jenna Cobbs are missionaries to Africa, centers in Botswana and sponsored by First Baptist Church, Texas. The mission that they are a part of started under a tree in Navasha, Kenya in 1992 and since then there has been 117,756 professions of faith, 469 self-supporting New Testa-

ment Churches which support their own pastor, 981 men surrendered to preach and 397 graduated from the a Bible Institute. Botswana's population in 2005 was 1,640,000 with a land mass of 231,804 square miles (slightly smaller than Texas). Gaborone is the capital city. The terrain is

mostly an arid plateau with a subtropical climate. The population is mainly Tswana who speak a Bantu language however English is their official language. Cattle is their chief economic means with cotton, peanuts and sunflowers as cash crops and corn, sorghum, millet and beans as subsistence crops.
